About The Performer

My second piece is sicilienne et rondo for Bassoon by Eugene Bozza's It was strongly influenced by late romantic music, which is evidenced by it's wildly dramatic flourishes, wide dynamic range and enormous registeral span that utilizes the entirety of the bassoon.
