Programme Notes

Erich Wolfgang Korngold Violin Concerto in D Major, Op. 35 I. Moderato nobile II. Romance (Andante) III. Finale (Allegro vivace assai)

Erich Wolfgang Korngold was born in 1897 and succeeded as a film music composer. This concert was premiered on February 15, 1947 by Jascha Heifetz solo and by the St. Louis Symphony Orchestra conducted by Vladimir Golschmann. 1st movement Moderato nobile: D Major. The magnificent melody sing by the violin solo without an introduction is based on the theme of the 1937 film score "Another Dawn". After a dynamic second theme, in the middle part, the melody of "Carlotta's Theme" in the 1939 film score "Juarez" is quoted almost entirely by violin solo. 2nd movement Romanze: G major. Guided by a mellow and mysterious introduction, the main theme of the romance movement by violin solo begins. The main theme is taken from the 1936 film score "Anthony Adverse " 3rd movement Allegro assai vivace: D major. Rondo sonata format. The second theme is taken from the theme music of the 1937 film score "The Prince and the Pauper" and is presented in B flat major by violin solo.
