Vladimir Tsybin Concert Allegro No.3

C.P.E Bach Flute Concerto in D minor

Carl Philipp Emanuel Bach, also known as C.P.E Bach (1714-1788) . He was one of J.S Bach's most prominent sons. Of Carl Philipp Emanuel Bach's six extant flute concertos, the Concerto in d minor is by far the best known. This concerto was composed in 1747 and it consists of three movements.

1. Allegro: The first movement is lively and energetic, characterized by its rhythmic drive and dramatic contrasts between the solo flute and piano.
2. In poco Andante: The second movement is a more slow-moving and serene,, showcasing the expressive capabilities of the flute in a sublime melody full of ornamentation.
3. Allegro di molto: The final movement is brisk and lively, returning to the energetic tone of the opening movement.



Vladimir Tsybin Concert Allegro No.3

Vladimir Tsybin was a Russian flutist and composer. Concert Allegro No.3 was written in 1946, three years before Tsybin passed away. It is the final and most challenging Concert Allegro written for flute by Tsybin, requiring technical proficiency and endurance, and clear understanding of musical form. In this piece, Tsybin employed the practice of repetition, a characteristic of Russian folk songs extended by continuous variations on a single motive. All five themes introduced in this piece have melodic quality in each musical phrasing.
