C.P.E Bach Flute Concerto in D minor Vladimir Tsybin Concert Allegro No.3



Carl Philipp Emanuel Bach, also known as C.P.E Bach (1714-1788). He was one of J.S Bach's most prominent sons. Of Carl Philipp Emanuel Bach's six extant flute concertos, the Concerto in d minor is by far the best known. This concerto was composed in 1747 and it consists of three movements.

- Allegro: The first movement is lively and energetic,
 characterized by its rhythmic drive and dramatic contrasts between the solo flute and piano.
- 2. In poco Andante: The second movement is a more slow-moving and serene,, showcasing the expressive capabilities of the flute in a sublime melody full of ornamentation.
- 3. Allegro di molto: The final movement is brisk and lively, returning to the energetic tone of the opening movement.
