

1. Vivaldi Concerto in E minor

Vivaldi has written many bassoon pieces. This is a very classic bassoon concerto in Baroque period. There are 3 movements in total.

2. Berwald Concerto Op 2

Franz Berwald is regarded today not only as one of Sweden's most important composers, but also, due to his symphonies and his chamber music, as a leading figure in the history of Northern European music of the 19th century. This is one of famous piece in classic period. It consists of many variations.

3. Glinka Sonata

Mikhail Glinka is commonly regarded as the founder of Russian nationalism in music. This piece is adapted from the viola and is a representative work of the Romantic period but in Russian style.

4. Jean Francaix Divertissement

The Divertissement was written at the time of the first performance of the oratorio L'Apocalypse selon St Jean, which took place in Paris in June 1942. There are four short movements. In the first movement, it sounds like joking. The second movement describes an idyllic rural scene. In the 3rd and 4th movements, there are full of irregular rhythm and tricky writing, until the final quip—which takes everyone by surprise.
